Unlocking Our Inner Potential: A Journey to Peace and Fulfillment

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Born and raised in the Philippines, Fr. Leo Ortega, studied Occupational Therapy at the University of the Philippines, where he received his Bachelor of Science degree. He continued his studies in the same field at

the University of Southern California receiving his Master's degree in 1995. As a board-certified occupational therapist, he has worked in neurorehabilitation for many years. He entered St. John's Seminary in 2002 and was ordained for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles in 2008. Fr. Ortega served in the following parishes: St. Thomas the Apostle, Los Angeles, 2008-2012 (Associate Pastor); St. Stephen Martyr, Monterey Park, 2012-2016 (Pastor). In 2016, he was sent to Rome to pursue doctoral studies in Dogmatic Theology at the Pontificia Università della Santa Croce. He successfully defended his doctoral dissertation in January 2021, entitled: *The Sign of Kenosis in the Theology of David N. Power: Its Resonances with the Argentine Theology of the People, The Church of the Poor.* 



**Msgr. Austin Doran** was born in Dublin Ireland. His family came to Los Angeles when he was four years old. He attended Catholic schools in Los Angeles, and then the University of Southern California. At age 20 he entered St.

John's Seminary in Camarillo and was ordained in 1978 as a priest of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. After eight years serving as associate pastor in several parishes, he was asked to undertake graduate studies in Spiritual Theology, and then served for eight years as Director of Spiritual Formation at St. John's Seminary. From 1998-2010 he served as pastor of Our Lady of Grace Church in Encino, CA, and then served 12 years as pastor of St. Anthony Church in San Gabriel, CA. He retired in July of 2022, and now resides and helps as a priest at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church in Rowland Heights, CA.



Rosa Linda (AKA Linda) Gallegos, RN, CDCES, has been a Registered Nurse and certified Diabetes Care and Education Specialist for the last 30 years and has been in the medical field for 42 years. Presently, she works for Martin Luther King Community Healthcare.

Linda's previous works included LA County General Hospital, Glendale Memorial, LA County Research in Diabetes, Scan Health Plan, Harbor UCLA Hospital, Health Care Partners, and Optum. She covers almost all aspects of diabetes, from gestational, teenagers, adults, and seniors. She teaches all aspects of diabetes, from medications, insulins, glucose monitors, glucose sensors, and insulin pumps. Under her scope of practice, she teaches nutrition.



**Fr. Dave Heney** is the pastor of St. Bruno Catholic Church. The son of a scientist, he was ordained in 1978 and holds a Master's Degree in Marriage, Family, and Child Counseling from USC. He is the author of "Don't tell me what to do, a

Catholic understanding of modern moral issues" and "Luke 10 Leadership," and "Physics & Faith, what modern science reveals about our universe" He leads an annual Holy Land Archaeological Tour, now in its 20th year. In 2002 he founded the University Series.




**Fr. Bao Huy Nguyen** is a priest of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. In 2010, he successfully defended his Master's thesis on the spirituality of Cardinal Nguyen Van Thuan, with original research done

in Vietnam. In 2021, he obtained a doctorate in canon law (Juris Canonici Doctor) in Rome. Fr. Bao is currently serving as an assistant professor of canon law at St. John's Seminary in Camarillo.



**Deacon Rogelio Garcia** has been a parishioner at STM for about 28 years. He joined the Deacon formation in 2006 and was ordained a permanent deacon in 2011. He has been serving St. Thomas

More Catholic Parish for 13 years as a deacon. He has a MA degree in Education and a MA degree in Pastoral Theology from LMU.



Fr. Thai Le is a native of Viet Nam and studied at St. John's Seminary in Camarillo, CA. He was ordained a parish priest in May 2008 for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. He has served four years as an associate pastor at St. Paschal

Baylon in Thousand Oaks. In May 2009, he studied Marriage and Family Counseling from California Lutheran University, in Thousand Oaks and graduated in May 2012. In 2012, he sent to serve three years as an associate pastor at Nativity Parish in El Monte and one year at Immaculate Heart in Los Angeles. In 2016, he was transferred to St. Thomas More Catholic Church as an administrator for two years and later became the pastor of this parish up to the present.
